Thank you for coming. We're glad you're here! Although things are somewhat different due to physical distancing, our typical order of service is Welcome and opening prayer; Worship through music, prayer and giving; Release of children (infants through 5th graders) and their teachers for classes; Worship through God's Word (sermon); and Closing prayer. Here are changes we have implemented:

We are offering two services: 8:30 am and 10 am. The one-hour services will mirror one another in preaching and music, with physical distancing between family units at both services. Live streaming of the 10 am service will continue on our website at faith-family.org and on Facebook Live.

Children in the preschool class (3-5 year olds), kindergarten – second grade class and third through fifth grade class will meet in their classrooms during the entire 10 am service. The nursery suite for infants through two-year olds will be open but unstaffed for parents to use as needed during the 10 am service. The service is available to watch live on the TVs in the nursery classrooms.

The Journey (Coffee) Room is open with a limited menu. Extra coffee kiosks have also been added. The Journey Room will close at 10 am.

¹³ For you have been called to live in freedom, my brothers and sisters. But don't use your freedom to satisfy your sinful nature. Instead, use your freedom to **serve one another in love**. ¹⁴ For the whole law can be summed up in this one command: **“Love your neighbor as yourself.”** ¹⁵ But if you are always biting and devouring one another, watch out! Beware of destroying one another. ¹⁶ So I say, let the Holy Spirit guide your lives. Then you won't be doing what your sinful nature craves. ¹⁷ The sinful nature wants to do evil, which is just the opposite of what the Spirit wants. And the Spirit gives us desires that are the opposite of what the sinful nature desires. These two forces are constantly fighting each other, so you are not free to carry out your good intentions. ¹⁸ But when you are directed by the Spirit, you are not under obligation to the law of Moses. ¹⁹ When you follow the desires of your sinful nature, the results are very clear: sexual immorality, impurity, lustful pleasures, ²⁰ idolatry, sorcery, hostility, quarreling, jealousy, outbursts of anger, selfish ambition, dissension, division, ²¹ envy, drunkenness, wild parties, and other sins like these. Let me tell you again, as I have before, that anyone living that sort of life will not inherit the Kingdom of God. ²² But the Holy Spirit produces this kind of fruit in our lives: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, ²³ gentleness, and self-control. There is no law against these things!
