Grand Ole Opry Veteran Daryl Mosley is coming to Fayette!

From countless appearances on "The Grand Ole Opry" to classic shows at the famous Bluebird Cafe to over 150 concerts per year, singer/songwriter Daryl Mosley has been sharing his songs and stories for over 30 years. Daryl has written three **Song of the Year** award winners, ten of his songs have made it to number one, and he has been named **Songwriter of the Year** three times! His songs have been recorded by bluegrass legend Bobby Osborne, country star Lynn Anderson, and Southern Gospel's The Booth Brothers. One of his best-known songs, "(Ask the Blind Man) He Saw It All," was named one of the top Southern Gospel songs of all time!

Daryl says, "I just write and sing songs about real life and real people; songs about faith and home and community are the foundation of my music because those are the things that are most precious to me." Daryl's concert is an intimate opportunity to hear his songs of life and faith as well as the entertaining stories of the people and events that inspired them.
